5. Review Ice Center site plan and Capital Soccer Proposal: Jon Siegal-30 min.

- Paul Huttins
- Jon, President of the Ice Center, presented the history of the ice Center conceptual site plan.
- Jon cites potential parking challenges with the increased activities on the Ice Center site.
- Jon feels the addition of two soccer fields will create the need for possibly 150+ parking spaces.
- The Utility Commission is the owner of the property; the Ice Center has a 99 year lease on the ice rink footprint.
- Jon anticipates the rink being busy year round with programming.
- Paul represents Capital Soccer, which is a premier soccer club that serves paying athletes from age 8- 17 plus adult leagues.
- Jon suggests moving the existing road in order to provide space for the proposed soccer fields and requisite parkings spaces.
- Cost estimates to move and pave the road are upwards of \$100,000.
