Minutes:

- 1. Meeting called to order at 5:03
- 2. No changes to agenda, motion to approve agenda by Curtis, seconded by Shannon, approved unanimously
- 3. Motion to approve November 2020 minutes by Dan, seconded by Christine, approved unanimously
- 4. Town Manager's Report
  - a. Not much to report as Bill has been working on the Town budget. Town is still mostly closed to visitors; highway crew on alternating weeks to limit exposure. No questions for Bill.
- 5. Treasurer's Report
  - a. No significant change in the finances.
- 6. Library Director's Report
  - a. Some discussion on the RB digital changeover; appreciation for the "We're here for you" promotion on Facebook and Front Porch Forum
- 7. Other Business
  - a. 2021budget reviewed the draft budget supplied by Almy that she created with Bill's input. Unemployment insurance, health insurance, and worker's compensation are up dramatically, but that is state-wide due to COVID, and not unique to town or library; virtually no raises since 2019, and minimal

staff expense increase (.03%) for 2021, offset by reduction in other expenses. This includes following through on the plan to increase the tech position by 4 hours per week, which is definitely needed, especially in this tech-heavy year. Spending reductions of 2020 will likely create a balance forward, allowing the library to propose a budget equal to or less than the 2020 budget. This accomplishes not raising the tax rate to support the library.

- b. Public computer replacement Bob Butler provided a price for purchasing and installing new computers; discussion about accepting a combination of donated computers from VTC and new computers, all installed by Bill. Also discussion on budgeting for regular, annual computer replacements, perhaps at two per year to create a four-year rotating cycle. More decisions on this in January when real numbers are in to finalize a budget.
- c. Follow up commissioner recruitment discussion on a candidate who is interested.
