Treasurer's Report: Paul Willard - The Annual Appeal has brought in \$3240 and more will likely come. There is \$32,052 in the checking account, \$100,872 in the T. Rowe Price investment account and \$30,315 in the Capital account for a total of \$163,340.17. No new members.

Curator: Jack Carter The deassession committee will now meet at the storage units because the Town Officers are closed again because of COVID-19. They are planning to organize a yard sale next summer with items that are duplicates or extraneous.

There are about 100 hard covered copies of the book, **Bridges**, and 35 soft-covered. There are lots of copies of the Waterbury Civil War Volunteers and a lot of the books that Kevin Eurich wrote.

Bridgeside (Hiata DeFeo) returned the WHS books that had been on display at the book shop. Jan will ask the new owner, Katya d'Angelo, if she would be willing to sell our books.

Wish list – old style slide projector. Cheryl will put a note in the newsletter. Jack may have a lead on one. He does have some carrousels.

The Society has lots of news clippings and papers including the original Waterbury Record. Anne has a complete set of Exit 10. Does the Secretary of State have digitized copies of those papers as well as the Times Argus. What the state has is not indexed. Should Exit 10 be put on Past Perfect? Cheryl is putting the recent Waterbury Record on Past Perfect.

Betsy Ayers Shapiro has some family items to donate.

Outreach – Book Committee: Jane Willard - The committee is nearly ready to hire a production assistant which will be a contracted position. Cindy Parks is in charge of the application process. They will next meet on Nov. 22 via ZOOM. They have received about 50 excellent submissions for the book.

The **Senior Center** has been closed since March, however, Meals on Wheels are being delivered to about 80 folks. Many recipients are quite isolated and lonely. The new chair of the Senior Center, Justin Blackmun and the Board have given the Outreach Committee permission to include mystery photos with the lunches. The thought is to give small gifts and perhaps one of the Eurich books at a later date.
