Waterbury Flood-Relief Update Tuesday 11/8/2011

News from the Waterbury Flood-Relief Effort with ReBuild Waterbury at Thatcher Brook Primary School this week.

The Municipal Offices are now located at the Main Street Fire Station.

FEMA APPLICATION DEADLINE NEXT TUESDAY, NOV. 15

Although the Federal Emergency Management Agency closed its Disaster Recovery Center at the Main Street Fire Station last week, Nov. 15 is the deadline to file an application for assistance. FEMA remains reachable by phone 800- 621-FEMA (3362) or online at www.disasterassistance.gov. Contact FEMA especially if your housing situation has changed and you would like assistance with rent for temporary housing. Also, if you have a question about your assistance or want to appeal your grant, you have 60 days from the date of your FEMA settlement letter to request it be reviewed. Incorrect or missing information can affect your grant. TIP: Renters at the time of the flood who were displaced from their homes because their building sustained damage could be eligible for housing assistance.

NOV. 15 DEADLINE ALSO APPLIES TO SBA LOAN APPLICATIONS STILL NOT SURE ABOUT APPLYING FOR SBA ASSISTANCE? NEED HELP WITH FORMS? HAVE QUESTIONS?

Important: With the deadline a week away, this is a final opportunity to meet face-to-face with SBA and FEMA staff to answer questions and complete forms for aid. Small Business Administration low-interest loans are NOT just for businesses. Homeowners, landlords, tenants — all who received a loan application --- are encouraged to complete it by Nov. 15. The SBA can open a door to both low-interest loans and additional FEMA grant money. (Those who don't qualify for a loan may receive additional FEMA grant money for personal property, moving and storage expenses, etc. if they have not already received the maximum benefit of \$30,200.) There is no requirement to take a loan. SBA also can structure loans in various ways including working with existing mortgages. Finally, loan approval is based on flood damage and ability to pay, not on personal assets.

For help with forms, come to the Wednesday meeting. Alternately, call the SBA at 800-659-2955 or 800-877-8339 for people with speech or hearing disabilities. Applications can be downloaded from www.sba.gov or completed online at https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela/

Griswold reminds the community that all are welcome to stock up their pantries including those hosting friends and family affected by the flood. Also, small donations of non-perishable foods are welcome, but please hold off on large food donations for now. Cash contributions welcome.
